2.20.010 Enforcement authority. The enforcement of city ordinances may be performed by the county sheriff and his duly appointed deputies and any city law enforcement officer, who shall have jurisdiction to preserve the peace and quiet of the city, to diligently inquire into and make complaints against any and all persons guilty of the violation of any of the ordinances of the city or laws of the state, to prevent crimes, to arrest offenders, to protect the rights of persons and property, and to generally obey and enforce all ordinances of the city, laws of the state and of the United States. (Ord. 226 §1, 1981)

2.20.020 Contract for intergovernmental agreement. The mayor may be authorized by the council to enter into a contract with the county for the intergovernmental agreement to provide the services described in Section 2.20.010. (Ord. 226 §2, 1981)

2.24.010 Establishment. There is reestablished a city planning commission for the city. (Ord. 253 §1, 1984)

2.24.020 Membership. The commission shall consist of five members who are not officials or employees of the

city. The majority of members shall be residents of the city, with all members residing within the city urban growth boundary unless waived by a majority vote of the entire city council. (Ord. 304 §2, 1991: Ord. 253 §2, 1984)

2.24.030 Terms of office. Commission members shall be appointed by the mayor. Planning commissioner terms shall commence on the first day of July of the first year of each term. The term of office of a planning commissioner shall be three years, or until an incumbent's successor is appointed and qualified. (Ord. 253 §3, 1984)

2.24.040 Vacancies and removal. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term. A member may be removed by the city council, after a hearing, for misconduct or nonperformance of duty. A member who is absent from three consecutive meetings without an excuse as approved by the planning commission is rebuttably presumed to be in nonperformance of duty and the city council shall declare the position vacant unless finding otherwise following the hearing. 2.24.050 Presiding officers. At its first meeting after July 1st of each year, the commission shall elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson to serve one-year terms. (Ord. 253 §5, 1984)

2.24.060 Staff services. The city council shall provide a secretary to the commission, and such other staff and consultation services as may be appropriate. The secretary shall keep a record of commission proceedings. (Ord. 253 §6, 1984)

2.24.070 Meetings. A majority of members of the planning commission shall constitute a quorum. The commission shall meet at least once a month unless cancelled by authority of the chairperson. Meetings of the commission shall be open to the public and public meeting laws shall apply. (Ord. 253 §7, 1984)

2.24.080 Powers and duties. The commission shall have the powers and duties which are now or may hereafter be assigned to it by charter, ordinance, resolution or order of the city and general laws of this state. (Ord. 253 §8, 1984)

2.24.090 Rules of procedure. All parliamentary questions which may arise before the planning commission, not otherwise provided for, shall be determined by Roberts Rules of Order. (Ord. 253 §9, 1984)
