9.24.010 Concealed weapons.

Except as provided in ORS 166.260 and 166.290, as now constituted and hereafter amended, no person shall carry concealed about his person or carry concealed in a vehicle a revolver, pistol or other firearm; or any knife other than an ordinary pocket knife; any dirk, dagger or stiletto; any metal knuckles; or any other weapon by the use of which injury could be inflicted upon the person or property of another. For purposes of this section, an ordinary pocket knife is one with a maximum blade length of three and one-half inches, which is not a switchblade or spring-blade knife. (Ord. 110 §21, 1974)

9.24.020 Discharge of weapons.

Except at firing ranges approved by the chief of police, no person other than a peace officer shall fire or discharge a gun, including spring or air-actuated pellet guns, air guns, or BB guns, or other weapon which propels a projectile by use of gunpowder or other explosive, jet, or rocket propulsion, except in the defense of ones person, as permitted by Oregon Revised Statute 161.219. 9.28.010 Hours of curfew.

It is unlawful for any person under the age of sixteen years to be upon, loiter, wander or stroll upon the

streets, alleys, avenues, parks or any other public place on any night except Friday or Saturday nights between the hours of ten-thirty p.m. and six a.m., and on Friday and Saturday nights between the hours of twelve midnight and six a.m.; and it is unlawful for any person under the age of eighteen years and over the age of sixteen years to be upon, loiter, wander or stroll upon the streets, alleys, avenues, parks or any other public place between the hours of twelve midnight and six a.m., unless such person shall be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or other adult person lawfully and properly accompanying said minor person, or unless said minor person is on an emergency errand or other legitimate business as directed in writing by the parent, guardian or other proper person. 9.28.020 Responsibility of legal guardian.

It is unlawful for any parent, legal guardian or any other adult person having the legal care and custody of any minor person under the age of sixteen years to allow or permit any such person to go upon or be upon any street, alley, park or other public place on any night except Friday and Saturday nights between the hours of twelve midnight and six a.m., and it is unlawful for any parent, legal guardian or any other adult person having the legal care and custody of any minor person under the age of eighteen years to allow or permit any such person to go upon or be upon any street, alley, park or other public place on any night between the hours of twelve midnight and six a.m. (Ord. 25 §2, 1952)

9.28.030 Police-Powers and duties.

Any police officer and any other law enforcement officer is authorized and empowered, by virtue of his office, to take charge of any person under the age of eighteen years of age violating the provisions of this chapter, and to hold such person in his custody; and it shall be the duty of any such officer taking charge of any such person to thereafter notify the parents or guardian of such person immediately of their violation of the terms of this chapter, and to notify such parent or legal guardian that said person will be held in custody until said parent or legal guardian can come to the place said person is being held in custody to get said minor person, and said minor child

shall be held, pending the arrival of said parent or guardian. (Ord. 25 §3, 1952)

9.28.040     Legal guardian to take minor from police custody.

It is unlawful, and shall be considered a separate offense under this chapter, for any parent, guardian or any other adult person having the legal care and custody of any person under the age of eighteen years to refuse to come and take said minor person under their custody immediately to their home upon being so notified by the police officer. (Ord. 25 §4, 1952)

9.28.050     Violation-Penalty.

A. Any parent, guardian or other adult person violating the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a municipal offense. Any person convicted of an offense under this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars.

B. Any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of this chapter shall pay all reasonable attorney's fees incurred by the city for enforcement of this chapter against said persons. (Ord. 328, 1993: Ord. 25 §5, 1952)
